

BAFTA Television Awards with P&O Cruises – Red Carpet Viewing Areas FAQs

How do I visit the red carpet viewing area?

Places in the viewing area are assigned via a public ballot. To apply to be in the ballot, please visit the BAFTA website.

Does the application form guarantee me a place in the viewing area?

No. The application form puts you and your guest into a public ballot. Names are then drawn at random.

How many guests can I bring with me?

You can apply to bring up to one guest with you into the viewing area.

Can I turn up on the day to gain access?

No. It is not possible to purchase or apply for a wristband on the day. The only way to gain access is through the public ballot.

What time should I arrive to join the viewing area?

The red carpet viewing area will be open during the afternoon of Sunday 12th May 2024. Specific timings and arrival information will be released to successful applicants.

How old must I be? How old does my guest have to be?

All attendees must be aged 12 years old and above on Sunday 12th May 2024. Attendees under the age of 16 must be accompanied by an adult.

Is the viewing area accessible?

There is an accessible red carpet viewing area. You must apply to be in the accessible viewing area via a specific form. To apply for the accessible viewing area, please <u>click here</u>.

Can I leave and re-enter the viewing area once I have arrived?

No. If you leave the viewing area you will not be able to re-enter.

Can I bring luggage?

No. There is no cloakroom or space to store luggage in the red carpet viewing area. Please do not bring large cases or bags.

Can I bring food and drink into the viewing area?

Hot food and alcohol are <u>not permitted</u> within the red carpet viewing area. Cold food and water are allowed but water must be in a reusable water bottle. All litter must be taken away with you.

Can I change the name of my guest after I have applied?

No. Names cannot be changed once the application form has been submitted.

Will I need to bring photo ID with me?

Yes. You must bring photo ID with you in order to gain your viewing area wristband. If you do not have photo ID, please email Ceremonies@bafta.org

Are there toilets in the viewing area?

No. Unfortunately, there are no toilet facilities available in any of the red-carpet viewing areas.

Can I bring photography equipment?

No. Professional photography equipment is not permitted. Only Accredited Photographers and Media located in the press areas can use professional cameras. You will be asked to put the camera away if you use it on site and may be removed from the viewing area. Mobile phone cameras are permitted.

Is the viewing area under cover if it rains?

No. The viewing area is outside, uncovered and exposed to the elements.

Is there seating available in the viewing area or can I bring my own?

Seating is not available and there is not enough room for you to bring your own seats. If you have reduced mobility, we suggest you apply for a place in the Accessible Viewing Area separately where you can request a seat.
