Job purpose

The Bar Supervisor is responsible for working with the Front of House Management team to ensure there is a bar product and drinks offer befitting BAFTA's 'gold standard', and also ensure all staff deliver a high level of service to our members, clients and guests in all the bars of BAFTA 195 Piccadilly. There a 3 bars in the building (plus a dispense bar), one focused on serving members and their guests and the other two focused on delivering differing styles of events, from cocktail parties to sit down dinners. So a broad knowledge of how to deliver differing drinks experiences to guests is required.

- To have responsibility for the BAFTA 195 Piccadilly bar stocking policy in each of the differing bars
- To create the BAFTA 195 Piccadilly Bar Bible
- To create the BAFTA 195 Piccadilly cocktail lists
- To train the service teams (full-time team members and agency staff) on the delivery of the bars offerings in line with the Bar Bible content and drinks lists
- To ensure all members of the service teams adhere to all aspects of allergen requirements and food safety in relations to drinks and drinks preparation
- To lead the bar teams in the service and delivery of drinks experiences in both the members club and events spaces
- To meet all individual and team sales targets set by and agreed with the Front of House Manager



Key responsibilities and accountabilities

- To work closely with the Front of House Manager on bar stocking policies, par levels and stock ordering
- To create a bar focused Bar Bible and SOP's
- To create and constantly review the back bar offering of each bar, ensuring it reflects BAFTA's 'gold standard'
- To lead the bar teams in both the members club and events spaces
- To control the par stocks of mis-en-place, including ordering of all wet stock
- To create drinks lists and cocktails for all bar spaces and all events requirements
- To have a good knowledge of current drinks trends and regularly implement them into BAFTA

- To ensure all team members serve drinks correctly and in accordance with the SOP's
- To encourage bar upsells to promote sales
- To create offers and promotions relating to drinks sales
- To be fully conversant with the buildings physical and technical offer
- To have a working knowledge of all departments working practices
- To effectively delegate tasks to team members to ensure bars on all levels run efficiently and are always kept up to a high standard
- To ensure all bars, bar areas and stock rooms are always ready for service, clean and presentable

- A good knowledge of wines, Champagnes and grape varieties
- Excellent levels of presentation and communication
