In 2023, she was presented with the BAFTA Fellowship at the BAFTA Television Awards with P&O Cruises, which is the highest accolade bestowed by BAFTA and recognises an outstanding contribution to the industry. Syal was also rewarded the Lifetime Achievement Award at the Women in Film & Television Awards 2023.

Sval's television credits as a writer & performer include the multi award-winning comedy series Goodness Gracious Me and The Kumars at Number 42, for which she received a BAFTA nomination. Sval can currently be seen in Amazon's The Devil's Hour and The Wheel of Time, and in the title role in Acorn's Mrs Sidhu Investigates. Other television credits include The Split, Broadchurch, Back To Life and Code 404. Her credits as a screenwriter include Bhaji on the Beach, Anita and Me and My Sister Wife, for which she won two Asian Film Awards.

Syal's first novel, Anita and Me, won the Betty Trask Award and is the first novel by a British Asian writer to be included on the national school's curriculum.

CAROLYN AND SEAN are a mother & son writing team whose ability to laugh at life's absurdities comes from years in a cramped single parent household. Their writing's thematic throughline is class and gender inequality.

Sean studied acting at Rose Bruford College. He wrote a comedy short, now at festivals, and does improv as half of the troupe Two Assholes. Carolyn wrote doc series, including Amazon's Ted Bundy: Falling for a Killer, until winning the WGC's Sondra Kelly Award. The Meryl Street Writer's Lab encouraged her to move into scripted, writing two shorts and episodes of a comedy webseries about inclusion riders.

When 16 year-old Rhiannon faces a school scandal, her at-a-loss single dad Mark makes her join the local Girl Guides group to straighten her out.

CARYS is a writer from Cardiff, living and working in London. She began screenwriting in 2020 when a comedy script she wrote with her sister reached the top 50 of the BBC Interconnected submission, which received a record 6,803 entries. Carys has been selected for the All3Media & Edinburgh Television Festival New Writer's Collective, featured in Philip Shelley's script library, and has written and directed short films that have screened at festivals worldwide. Carys' passion is screenwriting, but she's also published short stories and won awards for her commercial work.
